## DRAFT MINUTES

### **1. Welcome of Chair**

The Chair welcomed all participants, especially those who were participating for the first time.

### **2. Introduction of participants**

All participants briefly presented themselves and indicated the latest activities, including upcoming major meeting. It was agreed that the GU Steering Committee should ideally meet twice each year.

Himiyama stressed the importance of the GeoUnions within ISC. Altan and Gupta agreed to prepare a white paper on the significance of the GeoUnions to be submitted to the ISC Board with a request that this be made available on the ISC web site.

The participants remembered R.B. Singh, IGU Secretary General and Treasurer who died in 2021.

### **3. Approval of the Agenda**

The Agenda was approved.

### **4. Approval of the Minutes of the GeoUnions Steering Committee virtual meeting on December 14, 2020.**

Minutes of the virtual meeting held on December 14, 2020, were approved.

### **5. GeoUnions Matrix table update and changes of GeoUnions members – new representatives**

The Chair requested all Unions to update the Matrix table and send her names of new representatives where appropriate. The table should list two representatives per Union, including full name, e-mail address, and affiliation. A photograph is also required to enable updating of the GeoUnions website.

### **6. Important news in Unions, reaction to the COVID-19 situation in individual Unions**

Yukio Himiyama highlighted the need for the GeoUnions to support global sustainability initiatives and to note our relationship with, for example, ISC and Future Earth. He reminded the meeting that the International Year of Basic Sciences for Sustainable Development was proclaimed by the 76th session of the United Nations General Assembly 2 December 2021 for 2022, stressing that the applications of basic sciences in various spheres of the human life towards the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

John Ludden reported that IUGS will be holding the XXXVI International Geological Congress in virtual format in March 2022.

Edoardo Constantini noted that many IUSS events had either been postponed or held online in 2020 – 2021 but had successfully hosted a series of webinars during this period. He invited participants to the XXII Congress of World Soil Science to be held in Glasgow, UK, from July 31 to August 5, 2022. IUSS will celebrate its centenary in Florence, Italy, in 2024.

Michael Meadows invited all Unions to celebrate the IGU Centennial and Extraordinary General Assembly, which will be held in Paris from July 18 to 22, 2022. It was agreed that the meeting represents an opportunity for some GU representatives to meet person.

Ando Makoto reported that the next URSI GA is planned to take place in May 2022 in the Canary Islands with the same fee for on-site and remote participants in May 2022. The Union had plans to celebrate its centenary in 2021 but this was postponed due to the COVID-19 situation. Special historical sessions and a book dedicated to the centenary were prepared. URSI has a special budget for young scientists and launched a competition for the best student paper in 2021; the second competition will take place in 2022. The 35th URSI Congress will be held in Sapporo, Japan in August 2023.

Tijs van Kolscholten announced that INQUA has launched a newsletter and planning for the XXI Congress in Rome on July 13 – 20, 2023 (in-person only) is underway. INQUA has established a Secretariat in Budapest and aims to increase its funding base.

Kathy Whaler noted the preparations for the next IUGG General Assembly (July 11-20, 2023). The organisation, which may still fall under the influence of the COVID-19 situation is anticipated to be on-site with an important focus on young scientists to enable them to engage face to face with more senior participants.

Tom Trainor sent the following message:

The ICA held a highly successful hybrid International Cartographic Conference in Florence, Italy December 14-18, 2021. While the overall registrations were lower than normal, 309 registrants were in person with 321 registrants on-line. The ICA was fortunate that the event occurred immediately following the inception of Omicron but prior to its viral spread. All events took place such as the International Map Competition, the Children's International Map Competition, the opening reception, the gala dinner, and the closing ceremony – each taking place in special historic locations in Florence. Several blogs were prepared during and immediately following the ICC that are available at [www.icaci.org](http://www.icaci.org).

In April 2022, the ICA Executive Committee plans to meet in person in Madrid, Spain in advance of a joint ICA Commission Meeting.

The next ICC will be held in Cape Town, South Africa in August, 2023. We are working with the Local Organizing Committee and the UN to make it possible for as many African countries to participate.

The issue of a 'position paper' having been raised at a previous GU meeting, KW, JL and MM agreed to collaborate on this to highlight the importance of integrating the social sciences into the geosciences.

## **7. News from the ISC Governing Board**

The Chair reported on the virtual meeting that Peter Gluckman, the new ISC President, held in January 2022 with member Unions. Several GU steering committee members had attended. The President indicated that he would like to strengthen relations between the ISC Governing Board and ISC members and is planning to organise virtual meetings with ISC members in the future. It was noted that the ISC is seeking the appointment of a new CEO since Heide Hackman is returning to South Africa. ISC has plans to open a Regional ISC office in Latin America and Unions will be invited to nominate individuals to the steering committee. The venue for the next ISC GA (2024) has not yet been decided.

## **8. ISC GeoUnions Standing Committee on Risk and Disaster Management**

Orhan Altan reported on the establishment of this committee which comprises members from the Union representatives (<http://www.iscgdrr.com>) and reported on several of its activities.

He requested that all GU member organizations promote the work of this standing committee by sharing website details and including links to the various Policy Briefs in their E-Bulletins.

The committee has been asked by the UNDRR to co-organise a session at the Seventh Session of the Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction, to be held in Bali, Indonesia from 23-28 May 2022. This will take place in “Thematic Session 3: Breaking the Silos – Toward Multi-hazard, Multi-sectoral Approaches to Managing Risk”

The committee has also been invited to nominate Guest Editors for a special issue of the journal *Sustainability* entitled "Monitoring and predicting natural hazards and environmental risk.

Members of the committee participated in the virtual GI4DM in 2020, the next version of which will be in Beijing November 2022.
